On Wednesday, December 21st the building trades class along with Mr. Whitens and Mr. Swanson held an open house where students were able to show the Tribal Chairman their completed project. Everyone who attended was impressed by the work and proud of the students.

This marks the third and final house the Building Trades class has finished and turned over to the Hannahville Indian Community. Under the direction of Mr. Whitens, Mr. Swanson and Mr. Paupore, various grades have worked on three different houses within the Cedarview subdivision.

In the beginning of the housing projects there were more hours allowed for the students to work on their building trades assignments, but a few years ago their time was cut down and limited so this house ended up taking much more time to be completed than the others. Over the course of five years many students lended hands in creating this three bedroom home. As you can see it has an attached two car garage, along with a full basement and porches on both the front and back.

Because the time for building these homes has been cut down dramatically, the buiding trades class will no longer be constructing homes. Instead they will now work on smaller designs such as sheds and possibly garages.

Mr. Whitens also informed me that he and Mr. Swanson will be retiring this year. It is sad to see them go, but I am grateful that we have had such amazing teachers with us for so long. Thank you to all the teachers and students throughout the years who have contributed to each project!

Pet Care



PROTECTING YOUR PETS DURING THE WINTER MONTHS



Happy New Year! With the cold winter weather settled over us, you need to stay warm and so do your pets. Some pets are built to handle cold weather better than others. Most, like you, can only handle extreme weather temperatures for a limited amount of time. A healthy, well-brushed German Sheppard can withstand short periods in a very cold environment much better than a small, short-haired Chihuahua. Never keep a small dog or puppy outside for any length of time, even if it is wearing a sweater and booties and has a dog house.



Tips for dogs: Keep your dog's feet clear of ice and salt. Your feet hurt when cold, sore or blistered, and your pet's feet hurt, too. Keep your dog's nails trimmed, trim the fur between their paws and use dog booties, if necessary.

Check your de-icer for chemicals that can irritate your pet's paws or stomach. Buy only "pet safe" de-icer. When your dog is done playing in the snow, the yard, or going for a walk, wash off their paws with warm water to remove salt and sand, de-icer and ice balls.



Did you know that keeping your pet well brushed out will also keep them warmer? Brushing is not just for looks.

Tips for cats: Keep your cat indoors over the winter. Freezing temperatures can cause frostbite on the tip of their ears and tails. Outdoor cats sometimes sleep under the hoods or in the wheel wells of cars for warmth. When the motor is started or the car moves, the cat can be injured or killed. If there are outdoor cats in your area, bang loudly on your car hood before starting the engine to give the cat a chance to escape.

Fast, Fun Animal Facts

* Dogs perform many useful tasks for humans including hunting, farm work and security, as well as assisting people with disabilities.

* The heaviest domestic cat on record is 46 lb 15.2 oz.

Are you surprised to learn that dogs and cats can suffer from hypothermia?

Hypothermia is when the body gets too cold to function, causing violent shivering, slow and shallow breathing, and a slowed heart rate. Gums may appear pale or blue. Your pet will have little to no energy, eventually will not respond at all, and may die if not attended to. If you think your pet has hypothermia, warm him/her slowly. If you find an animal you think may be suffering with hypothermia and you don't know what to do, contact a veterinarian immediately.

TRANSPORTER/OUTREACH AIDE – This part time, irregular hours (20 Hours per week) provides safe and efficient transportation to DHHS clients to attend group or scheduled Behavioral Health appointments as well as doing outreach to clients and some miscellaneous organizational tasks for the program. Gains and maintains certification in adult/infant/child CPR, community First Aid & Safety, Child Seat/Restraints, and other safety training as required by the program; may be asked to make overnight drives and extended trips, requiring irregular hours; provide a monthly report; provides basic CPR in cases of emergencies and assistance during emergency situations; implements activities related to the Access To Recovery grant, such as enrolling clients in the program, helping clients access relevant services and completing GPRA follow-ups.

QUALIFICATIONS: High school diploma or equivalent; must have valid driver's license and be able to meet the minimum insurance requirements regarding driving record in order to utilize tribal vehicles; must be courteous and punctual; must maintain client confidence and protect operations by keeping information confidential; must not smoke cigarettes/cigars/pipes while transporting clients or operating tribal vehicles; must not text, in any way, while transporting clients or operating tribal vehicles; must be able to pass the background and drug and alcohol policies.

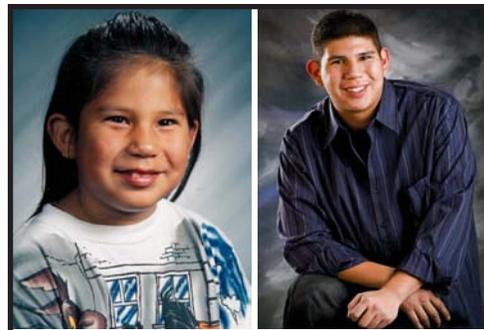

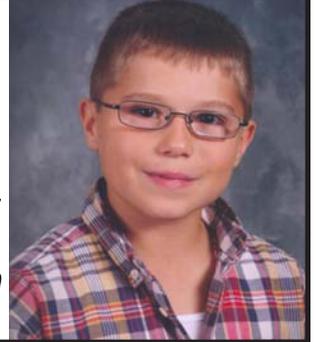
